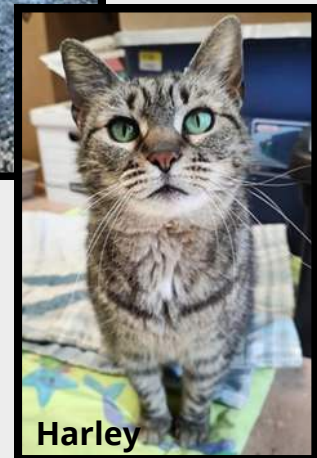

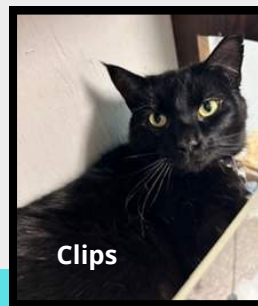

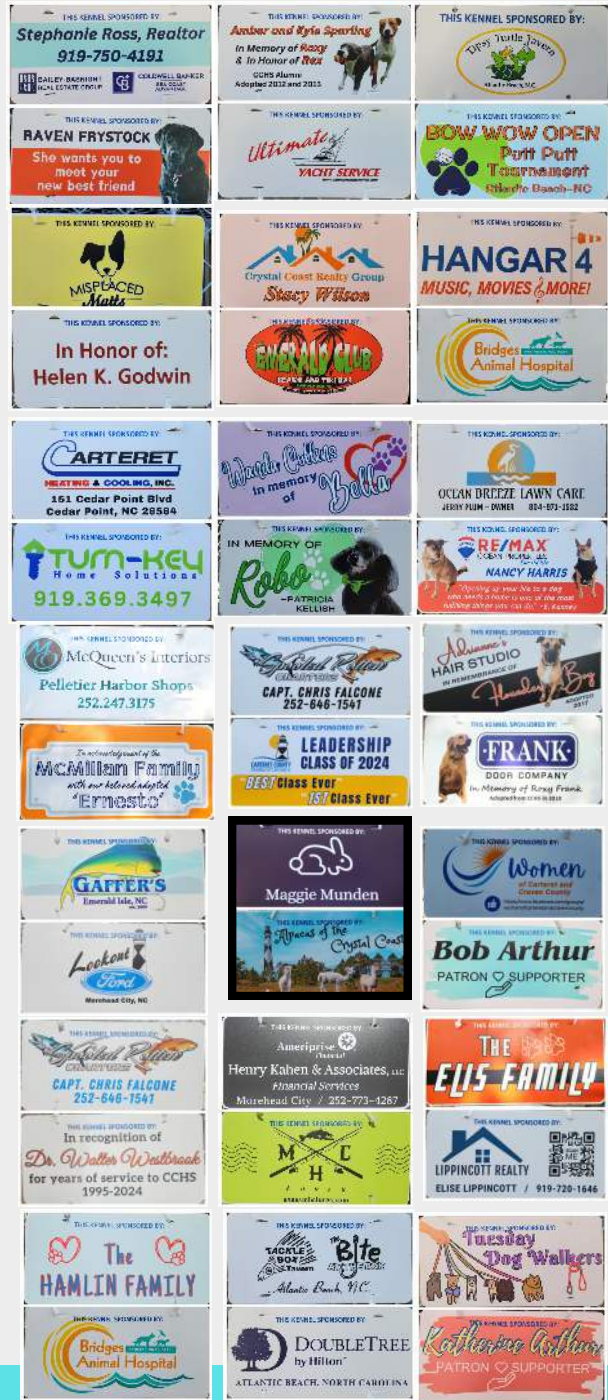
FUNDRAISING

Taking care of the homeless and unwanted animals of Carteret County requires money. Carteret County Humane Society hosts many fundraisers throughout the year. The newest one, Adopt-a-Kennel, has proven to be very successful. As shown in the photo, both businesses and residents have stepped up to adopt kennels at a cost of \$525/year. Collected money is used to purchase food for the shelter animals. The CCHS Board of Directors has been blown away by the community's support. To date, 42 kennels have been adopted.

There are also independent fundraisers which is when funds are raised for the shelter by citizens and businesses without the direct involvement of CCHS. The CCHS Board of Directors recently adopted a "Third Party Fundraising Agreement" which gives authorization to use the CCHS name and logo and provides assurance to contributors that the funds collected will be distributed to the CCHS.
